Being fully prepared for your trip will make it much more enjoyable.

#### Summer Season:

8.5' or 9' fly rods with 4 to 6 weight floating lines are some of the most versatile set-ups for our waters. A 9' 4x leader is a good general purpose leader, with spools of 4x and 5x tippet on hand for changing fishing conditions.

-Fleece Jacket or Puffy Jacket. (A good thing to have, even in the Summer, just in case cooler weather moves in.)

-Sunscreen.

-Dry Bag or Small Backpack to Store Personal Items. (In case it rains, a dry bag is best, so all your personal belongings you bring with, stay safe and dry.)

-Base Layer. NO COTTON!!! Wool or Synthetic Blends that pull moiture away from your body and quickly dry are a must.

-Insulating Layer. Fleece Wader Pants, Fleece Top, Vest, or Puffy Jacket.

-Wool Socks

-Polarized Sunglasses.
